H B BOSCOE'S NEW VIEW

Silly, smart, playful, loving: Aussiedoodle Boscoe has all the qualities of an ideal family dog. He loves every stranger, dog, and child he meets. With his tightly curled gray coat and bouncy demeanor, this handsome puppy seemed destined for a perfect life. Unfortunately, one thing held him back. When he was just over a year old, Boscoe's family noticed that he seemed to be confused and bumping into things in the house. They discovered that Boscoe was developing cataracts. Though he could still smell and hear the world around him, his sight was failing.

Australian Shepherds and Poodles are both smart, highly motivated breeds who need a lot of stimulus to keep them happy and busy. They like to have a job! But Boscoe's cataracts kept him from running around to get the exercise he needed. He spent a lot of time barking, frustrated that he could only detect vague shapes around him. Animal Allies Practice Manager Kelsey Pettit says that Boscoe's previous family reported watching him grow more and more distressed. "His lack of sight gave him a great amount of anxiety. He was destructive and reactive to new situations."

Boscoe's family knew that he needed professional help, so they made the difficult decision to surrender him to Animal Allies. To help minimize the stress of a mostly blind dog suddenly finding himself in an unfamiliar shelter environment, Boscoe went into a foster home. But he was stressed there, too. He felt confused and disoriented, and when left alone in the home he anxiously chewed everything within reach. We needed to take more drastic measures to help this sweet boy get his life back.

Animal Allies' shelter veterinarian referred Boscoe to a veterinary ophthalmologist, who determined that Boscoe would be a good candidate for lens replacement surgery. Most dogs and cats who come to the shelter with cataracts are seniors, calmer and slower-moving than Boscoe. Because they're usually more interested in relaxing than exploring, their loss of vison doesn't have a big impact on these pets' quality of life, and expensive surgery wouldn't be justified. But Boscoe is just over two years old and eager for adventure. Restoring his vision would transform his life.

So on September 2, Boscoe rode down to the Animal Eye Specialty Center in Andover, MN. There, expert staff replaced his clouded lenses with clear artificial ones. When he came to from anesthesia after the operation, he saw the world with new eyes. Volunteer Greg Smith recalls that Boscoe stood still outside the transport van, staring fascinated at the cars driving by. He could see them all!

After his procedure, Boscoe needed time to recover before adoption. Fortunately, first-time foster volunteers Beth Tamminen and Hal Moore were ready to welcome this goofy boy into their home for some R&R. According to Beth, "Boscoe, our first foster, arrived with a cone on his head, two sets of eyedrops, two kinds of pills, a hoarse voice (he could not get a bark out) and a body full of energy. On the first walk around Animal Allies we could feel that energy, but also recognized that he is a sweet dog, wishing to please, willing to do what is asked of him with a little affection and help."



Thanks to his fosters' patience, Boscoe recovered well, both physically and emotionally. "He settled in quickly," says Beth, "and was content even if he wasn't near us." He still preferred not to be left alone, though: "If he thought we were getting into a car, he let us know (with his now recovered bark) that he must get in too!"

With his vision, Boscoe regained his happy, playful personality. Soon his cone could come off and he was ready for adoption! On October 17, he went to his new home. His adopter says, "We are quite smitten with Boscoe! He has moved right into family life although we certainly don't trust him further than we can see him yet! He is very curious and friendly with boundless energy, but settles down quickly. We are looking forward to many adventures with Boscoe and are thankful for all the care that was provided to him at Animal Allies!" We are so proud that we were able to turn Boscoe's life around and give him the bright future he deserves.

A WHOLE MONTH OF LOVE-A-PET

Every fall, the Miller Hill Subaru dealership in Duluth welcomes Animal Allies and other local rescues for the Subaru Love-a-Pet adoption event. Our only off-site adoption event, over the years Love-a-Pet has allowed Animal Allies to find homes for dozens of dogs and cats who might otherwise have stayed longer at the shelter. In addition to adoption, Subaru weekend grew into a larger celebration of pets, featuring photos with Santa, a microchip clinic, and animal-related vendor booths.

This year, of course, everything is different, and a large in-person gathering was not feasible. Fortunately, the ASPCA and Subaru gave us the tools we needed to go virtual with the goal of saving even more homeless pets.

So the Love-a-Pet event was extended throughout the month of October, with the ASPCA funding reduced adoption fees for the whole month. Joining forces with Lake County Humane Society, the Babinski Foundation, and local vendors, we were able to continue in the spirit of Love-a-Pet to rehome even more animals. We ended up adopting out 27 kittens, 53 cats, 18 dogs and 6 puppies: a total of 104 pets!

We are so grateful to Subaru and the ASPCA for their commitment to this event and readiness to adapt to new circumstances.





LOOKING FOR LOVE IN ALL THE RIGHT PLACES

TAILS OF FOSTERING

The greatest unsung heroes of our volunteer ranks are our fosters. These are the folks who open their homes and their hearts to a shelter pet in need. They welcome the damaged, the fearful, the angry, the stressed, or the injured into their lives for a temporary safe haven. Fosters nurse the failing kitten at three in the morning, they comfort the frightened dog when there's a knock at the door, they give love to a dog or cat who has never known love before. They heal. They rehabilitate. They save lives.

This rewarding work is not without its heartbreak, but it's also chock-full of sweet victories and happy endings. We'd like to highlight a couple of our current foster heroes.

Anne Pilli and Katie Lozano

This dynamic mother/daughter duo have fostered several animals for us, including a severely overweight black lab named Lunna. When Lunna was brought to us after being found as a stray, she weighed almost twice what would be healthy for her frame. One month after arriving at Animal Allies, Lunna had reached at a critical point in her physical and mental health. Emotionally, she needed a break from the shelter. Physically, she urgently needed to start losing weight faster. Fortunately, Katie and Anne were up for the task and welcomed this lovely lady into their home. They carefully followed our shelter veterinarian's directives for diet and exercise, and in just three weeks Lunna had lost almost 20 pounds! Lunna loved the way her lighter body felt. She romped and played like never before, full of newfound energy. Not long after, Lunna found her loving home and is now living her best life. Her whole outlook totally turned around thanks to the care and love of her fosters.

Christa Feely Pederson

One of the most delicate and challenging tasks in animal welfare is caring for newborn kittens, especially those who come to the shelter without their mother. For the first weeks of their lives, kittens can't eat, wash, or go to the bathroom by themselves. They need to stay warm, but not too warm. They need to keep gaining weight steadily and also stay hydrated. They need to be kept clean, but can get chilled if given a full bath. Their immature immune systems are vulnerable to illness. Sometimes, for no apparent reason at all, a kitten will simply "fail to thrive."

Christa Feely Pederson is Animal Allies' neonatal kitten guru. All of our fragile, tiny neonates have their best possible outcome when they are put into Christa's loving, capable hands. She is our "kitten lady!" Cats can give birth to litters any time of the year, but late spring usually marks the beginning of "kitten season" here at Animal Allies. As the weather warms up, unspayed cats, especially those living outdoors, begin to breed—and they continue throughout the summer and into the fall. The resulting litters, with or without their mothers, often end up Animal Allies, where they must be cared for until they are weaned, vaccinated, and old enough to be spayed or neutered. The shelter is not the best place for growing kittens, so most of these little ones spend their first weeks in foster homes getting round-the-clock care.

A neonatal foster must have an instinct for this work. Beyond the patience, medical knowledge, and understanding of newborn survival techniques, a neonatal foster must have an intuitive sense that lets

them know when a kitten is failing just by holding or observing them. Christa is an expert. She has dedicated countless hours to these fragile little lives in her over ten years fostering for Animal Allies. Christa also has a very strong heart for this work. Even under the most experienced and loving care, tiny kittens sometimes do not make it past the first few weeks—or even days—of their lives. A neonatal foster will often have tears throughout their work, and also many stories of the courage of a sick kitten fighting to survive. We have a core group of about five neonatal fosters, and they have the touch of an angel, and the heart of a warrior.

Fosters save lives. We at Animal Allies are so lucky to have about 60 active fosters. There are so many animals in need, and we have so many loving homes to open their arms and their hearts when heeding the call for help.

WHERE ARE THE DOGS?

With unfamiliar times come unexpected challenges, along with the occasional surprising benefit. Rescue organizations like Animal Allies have had to navigate changes in our work for homeless animals. On the good side, adoptions have soared, both locally and nationally, since the beginning of the pandemic. As employees in many sectors work from home and students attend virtual classes, people who might once have struggled to make time for a pet are finding room in their lives for a dog or a cat. Kids spending more time around the house might demand a puppy to play with, while everyone knows there is no better stay-at-home coworker than a cat.

More adoptions mean fewer homeless pets, and that has always been animal rescue's goal. So what's the problem?

High adoption rates have one downside: potential adopters nationwide are having a hard time finding available pets, especially dogs. Because we work in an overwhelmingly responsible pet-owning community, we see fewer abandoned dogs and unwanted litters of puppies in the Northland with each passing year. This has opened up shelter space and given Animal Allies the chance to partner with

rescues from other parts of the country, helping to save the lives of dogs from overpopulated shelters by bringing them to Minnesota for adoption. But amid the uncertainty in the pandemic's early stages, animal transport was either not allowed or not encouraged. For a time, pets stopped travelling to Animal Allies from rescues like Rockwall Pets in Texas.

Furthermore, with spay/neuter surgeries deemed nonessential, we couldn't prepare dogs already in our care for adoption—creating a backlog of spays and neuters which Animal Allies, and many other shelters and clinics, has yet to catch up with. The ideal future would see

adoption rates stay high while Animal Allies returns to our normal rate of spay/neuter procedures and inter-rescue transports.

Fortunately, part of this is already happening. As soon as travel regulations eased, Rockwall Pets and Animal Allies teamed up again to rehome lone star dogs in the Northland. Here, former Animal Allies Adoption Counselor Courtney Greco tells the dramatic tale one very long trip from Duluth to Texas and back.

TEXAS TRANSPORT

Making the trip down to Texas was one of the most fun and also challenging experiences during my time here at the shelter. Between the 2 a.m. departure time and the fact that Starbucks wasn't open for another three hours, the first leg of the trip started out a little rocky. Leaving Duluth, the driving conditions were super foggy and we couldn't see the road all that well until we got closer to the Twin Cities. Luckily, that only lasted a few hours and we were back on the road with fresh Starbucks in the cup holders before too long. The rest of the drive down was pretty uneventful. Without a whole lot of varied scenery to keep things interesting, we had to get creative with fun road-trip games and a decent music playlist. We stopped at quite a few questionable gas stations and rest stops before we passed the Oklahoma-Texas border, but once we crossed the state line there was definitely a "light at the end of the tunnel" feeling.

Rockwall Pets was kind enough to offer us a nice hotel room to catch up on sleep for a few hours, but it felt like we were only out for a few minutes before that 1:30 a.m. alarm went off. By 2 a.m., we were down in the parking lot guiding 17 fosters to the right spots to load up the dogs they had been caring for. We had the awesome chance to connect with these lovely people. During a pandemic, you forget how nice it is to

have normal chats with strangers you meet in day-to-day life, so getting to know these wonderful, hardworking foster parents was a true gift. It lifted our mood as we got back on the road again.

With what sounded like the local circus loaded up into the back of our brand new van we were headed back home around 2:30 a.m. Unfortunately, our poor timing meant that we were once again undercaffeinated and running on only a few hours of sleep. Texas road construction and our clueless GPS led to at least three wrong turns and two or three missed exits before we finally found ourselves back on the right path.

The trip home was pretty good despite the alternating torrential downpour of rain and winds across the flat landscapes, but the brand new van handled it like a dream and we made it to the Twin Cities in good time. There, we met up with two other rescues to drop off half of the pups and made a quick fuel up for the last leg of the journey. By the time we finally made it back to Animal Allies, there were two amazing volunteers ready to welcome the new dogs to Duluth and start getting them ready to find their new loving homes!
